Minutes of the 901st Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of Baltimore November 9, 2023, at 10:00 am Virtual Meeting via Zoom

Moderator, Andrew Connors, called the meeting of the Presbytery of Baltimore to order at 10:04 AM. He opened the meeting with prayer. A quorum was present. He explained the raise hand function for seeking recognition on the "floor" and for voting.

He called on the Stated Clerk, Mary Gaut who moved the adoption of the Docket. It was seconded and **APPROVED** by common consent.

General Presbyter, Jackie Taylor, welcomed first time ruling elders and guests

A video presentation invited the presbytery to remember the Native Americans on whose land we reside in accord with our standing rule to begin each meeting with such a remembrance.

The Presbytery then moved into Morning Devotions planned by the Commission on Reconciliation. RE Bob Steppling led the time of devotion. In recognition of November as Indigenous Peoples Month, he read a quote from Charles Eastman, and early 20th century physician who was the first native American to be certified in western medicine. The reading emphasized the need to be open to the native American spiritual tradition. RE Steppling then led a time of prayer.

STATED CLERK'S REPORT AND CONSENT MOTION

Following devotions, the Moderator called upon the Stated Clerk who presented the consent motion. The motion included the approval of the minutes of the 900th stated meeting, approval of 2024 per capita as \$40, a waiver of term limits for the Hagerstown session, the validation of specialized ministries, the dismissal of the Administrative Commission for the closing of Covenant Presbyterian and the election of RE Karen Garret to the AC for Bridge Presbyterian. No motions were removed from the consent motion. It was seconded and **APPROVED** by common consent.

REPORT OF THE GENERAL PRESBYTER

Anchoring her report in a story about her father's work on components for Apollo rockets, Jackie Taylor encouraged the presbytery to embrace the changing shape of the church, paying attention to those outside the walls and recognizing that every obstacle can be a strategic opportunity.

REPORT OF THE PERSONNEL COMMITTEE:

The moderator called attention to the motion from the committee to approve the 2024 staff compensations as presented in the meeting papers (and appended to these minutes). Jackie Taylor responded to a couple of questions and the compensation budget was **APPROVED**.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON REPRESENTATION AND NOMINATIONS:

Rev. Deborah McEachran, chair of the committee, was recognized by the moderator. On behalf of the committee, she moved the following be elected as Baltimore Presbytery commissioners to the 226th General Assembly:

The motion did not require a second. There were no nominations from the floor and the motion was **APPROVED.**

The motion did not require a second. There were no nominations from the floor and the motion was **APPROVED**

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION ON MINISTRY

The moderator recognized RE and former Stated Clerk Catherine Blacka to speak on behalf of the retirements of Rev. Morton Harris and Rev. Sue Lowcock Harris. They retired as co-pastors of First Presbyterian of Howard Co., having served 18 years. In outlining their accomplishments she highlighted the way they helped heal the congregation have a time of tumultuous conflict and moved the congregation forward. The welcome area that was constructed to link the sanctuary and educational/office building and provide greater accessibility as been renamed "Harris Commons" in their honor.

After comments from Sue and Morton, the chair of COM, TE Mary Speers, offered a charge and benediction blessing.

The moderator recognized Jackie Taylor to speak to the pastoral transition at St. John United, a federated PCUSA/UMC congregation. The current pastor, Mary Ka Kanahan, has been reassigned by the UMC District Superintendent to another congregation. She spoke of Mary Ka's accomplishments at the church and involvement in the presbytery. Rev. Kanahan spoke briefly about her appreciation for the welcome and support of the presbytery through her years at St John United.

THE COMMISSION ON RECONCILIATION:

The chair of the commission, Rev. Karen Brown, could not be present so the moderator recognized RE Susan Krehbiel, Presbytery Social Justice Consultant, to present the commissions motion that the Presbytery of Baltimore be enrolled as a Matthew 25 Presbytery with the Presbyterian Mission Agency. The motion did not require a second. Rev. Ray Meute, a member of the Dismantling Racism Team and pastor of a Matthew 25 congregation (Highland) spoke on behalf of the motion, emphasizing the objectives of the movement as congregational vitality, dismantling structural racism, and eradicating systemic poverty.

Following discussion, the motion was APPROVED.

THE COMMISSION ON THRIVING CONGREGATIONS ANNUAL REPORT:

Commission chair, Rev. Melissa Lopez, reported on the work of the commission which includes the administration of Enduring Witness Grants, oversight and support of the three New Worshipping Communities: Light Street, Comunidad Presbyteriana Trinidad, and Slate, and the assistance to congregations utilizing tools for assessing congregational vitality. In 2024, which will pause the grant program as they are reevaluated, they plan to focus on the other two areas along with the development of quarterly events to connect and resource congregations in the areas of worship, Christian Education, Evangelism and Pastoral Care.

OLD BUSINESS

Moderator Connors reminded the body that at the previous meeting of the Presbytery the motion to remove The Center from the Presbytery Manual was "deferred to the 901st meeting so that the Center Steering Committee could decide on the disposition of the remaining funds.

Center Steering Committee chair, RE Susan Moody, reported:

Funds Distribution Plan

The balance of "The Center Restricted" funds as of November 3, 2023 is \$180,303.77. The plan for distributing the funds is:

- \$1000 to each of the 3 churches who participated in our new building exploration process in thanks for their work and their willingness to envision new things.
- \$4000 to each of the historically black churches in the Presbytery to immediately enable restorative work.
- The remaining funds will go to the Commission on Reconciliation for the establishment of a Fund for Reparative Actions

The Fund for Reparative Actions (The Fund):

- Distribution of funds will be administered by the Dismantling Racism Team, a special committee of the COR, for the benefit of people and communities of color within the bounds of the Presbytery of Baltimore.
- The Fund will issue grants to support BIPOC-majority congregations for the purposes of working to address areas impacted by structural racism, to include housing, health care, education, environment, and the economy/business.

Although The Fund may receive funding from other sources for the purpose of reparative actions, the funds received from The Center are to be disbursed only in accordance with the guidelines outline above.

The moderator then introduced the motion postponed from the September Meeting:

That section 11, The Center, be removed from the Presbytery Manual, along with other references to the Center, [5.3.10, 6.2.1, 7.12.1]. The motion was **APPROVED**.

There was no new business. A motion to adjourn was **APPROVED** and the meeting was closed with prayer at 11:51AM by the moderator.
