The Stated Clerk recommends:

2. THE APPROVAL of the minutes of the Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of Baltimore, as posted on the website. (www.baltimorepresbytery.org).

The Representation and Nominating Committee recommends:

3. That presbytery elect those listed in its report to the offices indicated (see meeting papers)

The Personnel Committee recommends:

4. That Presbytery renew the contract with General Presbyter Jacqueline Taylor through August 31, 2030 (five years)

The Dismantling Racism Team with The Commission on Reconciliation recommends:

5. That Presbytery establish a Reparative Justice Fund for the Repair of Historical Harms (see meeting papers for motions 5-9)

The Commission on Preparation for Ministry recommends:

- 10. That Presbytery examine Inquirer Josh Gilhart on his sense of call and approve his advancement to the status of candidate.
- 11. That Presbytery examine Jennifer Pearson on her statement of faith and approve commissioning her as Commissioned Lay Pastor at Babcock Presbyterian Church for 3 years beginning October 1, 2025.

The Commission on Ministry recommends:

- 12. That Presbytery approve amending the Manual section 7.9.5.2.1 (the commission's authority to appoint session moderators) to add "The commission may delegate this authority to the commission chair, the General Presbytery and/or the Stated Clerk, who must report appointments of moderators to the next meeting of the commission."
- 13. That Presbytery approve a 2.5% COLA increase in effective salary for installed and temporary pastoral positions. (Mandatory for those at the minimum for their factor and strongly recommended for all others)
- 14. That Presbytery commission CRE Troy Bailey to officiate the Sacrament of Communion at any church in the presbytery when invited by the session.
- 15. That Presbytery approve the revised Policy on Pastoral Compensation (meeting papers)
- 16. That Presbytery approve the revised Sexual Misconduct Policy as presented (meeting papers)

The Steering Cabinet recommends:

- 17. That Presbytery approve the proposed Anti-Harassment Policy (meeting papers)
- 18. That Presbytery approve the revised Child Protection Policy (meeting papers)
- 19. That Presbytery amend the Manual section 6.2.1 to add a member of the Nominating Committee and a member of the Dismantling Racism Team to the membership of the Steering Cabinet.

Commission on Ministry

The Commission on Ministry reports

At its Leadership Team meeting on July 2, 2025, it

- transferred TE Roger Rice (HR) to Cascades Presbytery effective July 15, 2025.
- Approved a Bridge Pastor contract between TE Jack Carlson (HR) and Good Shepherd Presbyterian
- Approved the Installation Commission for Hyiwot Teshome at St. John United Church
- Approved Babcock Presbyterian's request to consider having a commissioned lay pastor
 for primary pastoral leadership and will recommend that presbytery commission Jennifer
 Pearson to this role as she has successfully completed the course of preparation as
 required in the presbytery policies.

At its Credentials Team meeting on August 3, 2025,

 Approved the transfer of Rev. Kate Morrison from Lake Huron Presbytery so that she may accept the call as pastor of Light Street Presbyterian.

At its Leadership Team meeting on August 20, 2025 meeting

- Approved Commission CRE Troy Bailey to officiate at communion at any church in the Presbytery
- Approved recommending that presbytery commission RE Jenn Pearson as CLP at Babcock
- Approved Christ Memorial's factor change from 820 to 750 and approved their MDP

Commission on Preparation for Ministry

The Commission on Preparation for Ministry Reports that

- At its meeting on June 18, 2025, Certified Candidate Adena Moulton ready to receive a call and approved Inquirer and ruling elder Josh Gilhart and Inquirer and ruling elder Heather Russel to officiate at the Lord's Table when invited by a church session per G-2.0606
- At its meeting on Aug. 20, 2025, certified RE Jennifer Pearson ready to be commissioned as Commissioned Pastor at Babcock Presbyterian.

Property and Loan Commission

The Property and Loan Commission reports that, at its meeting on September 3, 2025, it

- Approved the final contract for sale of the property of Maryland Presbyterian
- Approved Ark & Dove Presbyterian's application to Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program for a \$325,000 to help finance property repairs and improvements for safety and accessibility, and recommended that the Trustees guarantee the loan as required by PILP
